Mr. Tom Kline discussed the recent legislative update on bills that were signed into law by the Governor. A total of 43 bills were listed on the site. 18 bills were signed into law relating to Law Enforcement.

AB 485, Nguyen, hate crimes: reporting - require local law enforcement agencies to post the information sent to the department on their internet website monthly.

AB 655, Kalra. California Law Enforcement Accountability Reform Act

AB 988, Bauer-Kahan. Mental Health: 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline

AB 1242, Bauer- Kahan. Reproductive rights

AB 1406, Lackey. Law enforcement agency policies: carrying of equipment

AB 1653, Patterson. Property crimes: regional property crimes task force

AB 1946, Boerner Horvath. Electric bicycles: safety and training program - statewide safety and training programs based on evidence-based practices for

AB 2043, Jones-Sawyer. Bail bonds - prohibit a person from performing the activities of a bail fugitive recovery agent unless the person holds a license, as specified.
